

J. Aumonier, Artist, Dead.

LONDON, Oct. 5.—J. Aumonier, the artist, died here to-day. He was a member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors.

J. Aumonier became a member of the Royal Institute of Painters in Water Colors in 1879, a society which claimed such famous men as Ruskin, Whistler, Burne-Jones, and Rossetti. He was also a painter in oil. Richard Muther in "The History of Modern Painting," says that he is the heir of Walker and Mason, and praises his landscapes. Aumonier, he says, reveals a sense of poetry in his paintings of valleys, and he speaks of the "odor of earth from his meadows." One of Aumonier's best-known paintings is called "The Silver Lining to the Cloud," and is the property of the City of Manchester, England.
